Officials with the Mathis Independent School District in Texas were trying to learn how to improve their school buildings and maximize funding when they reached out to a national free resource. Education Facilities Clearinghouse in Newport News sent a consultant to look at Mathis' facilities and make recommendations, said Christopher Casarez, Mathis schools' area administrator for operations. A thorough review of the facilities and their records helped officials there rearrange their priority list and find ways to save money in one place for use in another. "It really helped to discuss that with somebody who is very knowledgeable in that field, and it helped us reset our priority list," Casarez said. "So that helped us out a lot."
